The Wealth You Provide

Is \$350 *really* enough to completely change the life of a child? Absolutely! But don't just take our word for it. As usual, our children are far more eloquent and powerful in describing what you do for them than we could ever be.

Elizabeth P. is 11 years old and has been part of our program since May, 2005. Recently she sent a letter to her UAOCF sponsor discussing what her life is like. Her report is very straight forward, but so striking we wanted to share it:

"We really eat the best meals at school. We eat sweet potatoes, rice, posho (a corn-based dish), beans, ground nuts, cabbages and meat.

And at school we drink milk, tea, porridge and we can also enjoy playing games. I would like to tell you that our teachers at school always teach us very well. We study English, Science, Social Studies, (and) Mathematics. At school if you get sick, they give you medicine."

Perhaps that doesn't sound very unusual to you. But for an orphan in Uganda, simply being in a school of any quality is unusual – and getting a good education, good food and good medical care is almost unimaginable. Elizabeth goes into such detail about food, school and the rest because this is all so new and wonderful to her. Another orphan hearing her story

might reasonably marvel, "You get *all that*!!? That can't be true!"

Elizabeth knows and appreciates how true it is. She wrote, "I would like to thank you because we were in the villages suffering...but because of your mercy you helped us." Other children echo those sentiments. Edward B. recently wrote to his sponsor, "In a village I don't eat good but at school I get enough." Justine N. commented, "Because of eating well I have managed to get good performance in class." No child should ever go hungry – or without a good education. Thanks to you, no UAOCF child ever will know those wants again.

A Visit to Uganda

If you have been to one of our annual Heart to Heart events, you have almost certainly met Magna Gibbs. Magna was one of the founding members of UAOCF's Management Committee, and has visited Uganda before. In July, Magna went to Africa once again and visited our program.

Magna was travelling with a group and took several friends with her to visit Kabale. They stayed there for two nights, met our staff and visited with our children. Magna's friends were not all familiar with UAOCF, and they were very impressed with our work and our children. It was clear to them that our orphans are all well cared for. The children asked Magna and her friends to bring a message back for you, our supporters: a message of thanks. They want you to know that they are very grateful to you and UAOCF for allowing them to be in school and for giving them the

opportunity to have a good education and to achieve their dreams. Magna shared many pictures of the children with us. Take a look: we think you'll see for yourself how happy you've made them.

Time to Update Your Ralphs Card Again

It's that time again! Every Sept. 1, Ralphs requires participants in its Community Contribution Program to re-register their Ralphs Rewards cards. In the past year, UAOCF received \$915 in donations from Ralphs' Community Contribution Program – almost enough to fully support three orphans!

For those not familiar with this program, all you need is a Ralphs Rewards card (which you get for free at Ralphs). These are the cards cashiers scan that often entitle you to special discounts. If you register your Ralphs card with the Community Contribution Program and ask to support UAOCF, a portion of your total will go to UAOCF. You don't pay anything more

than you otherwise would, and UAOCF gets a great donation!

If you have a Rewards card and haven't registered, please do it now! Go to the Ralphs home page (www.ralphs.com) and click on "Community Contribution." On the page that comes up is a box titled "Participant," with a button that says, "Sign Up." Click the sign up button, follow the instructions and fill out the form. Enter UAOCF's Charity ID number: 90316. It's a quick and painless way to raise money to help our children! Direct links to the Ralphs page are posted on UAOCF's web site to help you register.

The online registration process may seem a bit complicated for some folks. Never fear, there's another way! Ralphs has a scanbar letter you

can give to the cashier – they scan it and you're registered. Download the scanbar letter from our website: (http://uaocf.org/painless_giving.html). Just click on the words "PDF file" where it says "If you have problems with the online instructions you can print this [PDF file](#) and take it to your local Ralphs" to download the scanbar letter. No computer? No problem! Contact us by phone or postal service and we'll send you a scanbar letter by mail. That's all it takes to register your Rewards card and start benefitting our children.
